Elon Musk Says He Will Not be Taking the Coronavirus Vaccine

In a recent appearance on the New York Times podcast "Sway" with Kara Swisher, Elon Musk reported that neither he nor his children would be getting a coronavirus vaccine when it's readily available. "I'm not at risk, and neither are my kids," Musk said on Monday. Musk also called the national lockdown a "no-win situation" that has "diminished my faith in humanity".

This statement from Musk comes after months of criticism on how the U.S has handled the virus and the lockdown. He has previously referred to the coronavirus as "dumb" and called widespread lockdowns "unethical" and referred to them as "de facto house arrest".

Alternatively, he has proposed that we try the targeted lockdown approach, putting anyone at risk on lockdown. Swisher said people could potentially die in response to Musk's suggestion. "Everybody dies," said Musk.

Bill Gates has recently claimed that Elon Musk does not know much about vaccines and suggested that he should stay out areas that he isn't involved in. Musk later responded by saying "Hey, knucklehead, we actually make the vaccine machines for CureVac, that company you're invested in." Tesla manufactures equipment for CureVac, the German biopharmaceutical firm.
