The video also states that Israel is almost entirely vaccinated and yet, their numbers show that they have a higher rate of Covid-19 now than they did a year ago, as well as a higher ICU hospitalization rate. As many as 90% of their ICU patients are vaccinated. According to Worldo Meters, this

checks out.

Israel is now suggesting that the Covid-19 vaccine wears off in six to eight months, and is recommending a booster shot to the population over 60.

Preliminary findings from an outbreak of Covid-19 in Provincetown, MA after the 4th of July shows that as many as 75% of infected people were vaccinated. The majority of Massachusetts is vaccinated.
